and dream that my paper boats float on and on under
the midnight stars.
The fairies of sleep are sailing in them,
and the lading is their baskets full of dreams.

Answer the following question: (4X1=4)

1. What does the speaker do when night comes?

Answer: The speaker buries their face in their arms and begins to dream.

2. Where does the speaker imagine the paper boats are floating?

Answer: The speaker imagines that the paper boats float under the midnight stars.

3. Who does the speaker believe are sailing in the paper boats?

Answer: The speaker believes that the fairies of sleep are sailing in the paper boats.

4. Who is the author of this Poem?

Answer: Rabindranath Tagore

Q1 Why does the poet write his personal details on the paper boats?

Ans: He writes his name and village hoping that someone in a strange land will find the boats and know who he is. This shows the child’s desire to reach out and be recognized a simple, innocent wish to make a connection beyond his immediate world.

Q2 The poet talks about the imagination of a child. Support this view with examples from the poem.

Ans:

- He fills boats with **shiuli flowers** and believes they will be safely carried to land.
- He sees the **clouds as “white bulging sails”**, turning weather into part of his play.
- He imagines a **playmate in the sky** who sends downwind to race the boats.
- At night he dreams **fairies of sleep** sailing in the boats with baskets full of dreams.
All these show how the child mixes everyday things with fanciful images a clear sign of a vivid, playful imagination.

Q3 How does the poet bring together imagination and reality to make the poem more interesting?

Ans: Tagore places real, concrete details (paper boats, writing his name, shiuli flowers, the running stream) beside imaginative, personified images (clouds as sails, a sky playmate, fairies carrying dreams). This blending makes the child's feelings and longings feel real and believable while also lyrical and magical the ordinary becomes poetic through the child's eye.
