1 Sacred places in India often have rivers, mountains and forests. They are worshipped and protected due to their religious significance. Ganga river is considered as a goddess and many forests are considered as sacred groves. This connection teaches us to respect our environment while practicing our faith.

Sacred groves are protected by tribal communities and hunting and deforestation are not allowed. Worship of Ganga and Yamuna teaches people not to pollute them. Sacred trees like Peepul are not cut and respected. These beliefs and practices foster an attitude of environmental care and sustainability.
- Sacred geography includes places from major religions like Hindu temples, Sikh gurudwaras, Islamic dargahs, Buddhist stupas, Christian churches and Jain hills. People visit the sacred places during the festivals especially. This shared respect builds up harmony and mutual understanding while helping people connect spiritually and culturally. It reinforces India's diversity.
